

What have we accomplished in these 15 years?

We have been able to touch the lives of four and a half lakh people through various initiatives. These include our participation in initiatives in Health, Education, Community Development and Preservation of Heritage and Wildlife.

Over 15 years, our health projects have improved healthcare for many. We funded cleft surgeries on 4,716 children and 3,000 pediatric surgeries. We also provided nutrition programmes for nearly 7,000 babies and conducted over 12,500 cataract surgeries for senior citizens. Our initiatives include cochlear implants, squint corrections, spinal surgeries, mental health support, and more. Additionally, our mobile medical van, support for old age homes, and physiotherapy centre have helped 22,000 senior citizens. We've also assisted almost 2,000 individuals with the Jaipur Foot artificial limb project.

In the Education vertical, the Kiran programme has empowered 500 young women to become engineers and find jobs. We've supported 65,500 students in completing their school education and helped 10,000 students improve their academic performance. 1,700 individuals received vocational training, and more than 12,000 have gained employment through this programme. Toilet construction in 110 schools has benefited 21,000 children, and we've assisted over 700 specially-abled children.

In total, 160,000 students have used our services through various initiatives.

In Community Development, we cultivated 10,000 hectares of land, provided fodder for over 3,000 animals, and facilitated the birth of 1,000+ female calves through artificial insemination. We also planted 120,000+ trees, constructed 55 wells, and completed 16,000 km of desilting of rivers and canals. We collaborated with Rama Purushottam Foundation to construct hostels for schoolgirls and working women and residences for police constables. We also installed 11 solar rooftop plants, resulting in significant power bill savings of ₹ 3.5 crore. Through our newest vertical, Preservation of Heritage and Wildlife, we've supported the rescue of injured animals in forests by donating 4 ambulances. We've also helped print 2,000 books to preserve the tribal Kolami language, benefiting 20 schools and local community members.

During the 2020 COVID-19 pandemic, we contributed nearly ₹ 17 crore to various schemes. We provided meals and ration kits to 25,000 families, facilitated vaccinations for 43,000 people in 160 villages, supported 20,000 school children with education, helped nearly 600 individuals with livelihood support, set up 5 COVID Care Centres, and provided medical equipment to hospitals, including 32 ventilators, 2 Bipap machines, 130 oxygen concentrators, 2 oxygen plants, 80 ICU beds, and 20,000 PPE kits.





Our journey began with thoughtful donations and blossomed into handson projects with compassionate NGO partners. Our maiden ventures, the School Health Programme and Breast Cancer Screening Programme, seeded our commitment to preventive care.

### **Spreading Smiles** Comprehensive Care for Children with Facial Cleft / Cleft Palate

Providing crucial support to children from financially and economically challenged backgrounds who are born with a cleft lip or palate.

### Background

In many communities in India,

misconceptions and enduring superstitions shroud a treatable condition, often leaving families hesitant to seek help for their children. But when a hospital in Pune reached out for aid in 2012-13 for children with cleft lip or palate, we saw a chance to drive change and make a lasting difference.

Recognizing that there was scant corporate backing for this cause, we decided to step up and pledge our earnest support, making it our key initiative alongside Akila Bharata Mahila Seva Samaja (ABMSS) in 2017-18.

### **Contributions and approach**

We have allocated a substantial 58% of our Health Care vertical budget to this project. Through these funds, we offer a spectrum of services to underprivileged families free of cost, encompassing treatment and continual care. To date, our sponsorship has enabled 4,716 procedures.

Beyond surgeries, we have adopted an integral care model, encompassing orthodontics, speech therapy, and nutritional guidance.

This fiscal year alone, we have sponsored 795 operations and provided extensive care for 629 individuals across Pune, Aurangabad, Pandharpur, Nagpur, Hyderabad, and Bengaluru.

Our awareness initiatives have led to an increase in timely interventions, with 45% of patients receiving care before turning 3, fostering a nurturing turnaround in the lives of those over 18, as they reclaim self-esteem and transform their self-perception.

COVID-19 presented formidable obstacles in FY2O-21, but our dedication to comprehensive care remained steadfast. Amid restrictions, we conducted over 450 surgeries and assisted 456 patients at 14 centers for treating facial clefts and cleft palates. Additionally, 1,824 PPE kits safeguarded our patients and health professionals.

### Building confidence, one child at a time

With tailored care, children born with facial clefts not only breathe and eat with ease; their overall health flourishes. Post-surgery, orthodontic correction, and speech therapy have fostered societal embrace, particularly amongst their young peers.

Through this flagship endeavor, we aim to plant the seeds of hope by enabling holistic well-being, nurturing support, and reinvigorated self-assurance.

Superstitious reactions and feeding difficulties added to their distress. A pediatrician informed them about ABMSS's cleft care programme, where Swara underwent successful surgery. Her transformed appearance brought joy to the family. Swara's story highlights the impact of accessible healthcare and human resilience, demonstrating how proper support can overcome challenges and offer hope for a child's future.

The chairperson's passion, team expertise, and the Foundation's commitment have inspired communities. Background

Our collaborations began with HelpAge India and expanded to include partnerships with institutions like the Dr. Manohar Dole Medical Foundation, Seth Tarachand Charitable Hospital and the Hyderabad Eye Institute. These relationships have fortified our mission, enabling us to extend our reach and touch the lives of more individuals.

By focusing on those over 60 from less affluent backgrounds, we not only restore their sight with artificial lenses but also their sense of dignity and autonomy.

We have had the privilege to support numerous cataract surgeries, remaining committed through a myriad of local and global challenges, including the COVID-19 pandemic. Our mobile medical units have played a crucial role, ensuring that no one-regardless of their situation-feels abandoned or invisible.

In Hyderabad, the deployment of community eye screening kits has been particularly effective, enabling the screening of over 108,000 individuals in 3 years who could benefit from this transformative surgery.

#### Creating a vision of hope and healing

With every step we take and every surgery we perform, we at the Persistent Foundation are deeply honored to contribute to the well-being of the elders in our society. Our aim is to illuminate their later years with the brightness, joy, and sense of purpose they deserve, reinforcing the foundation of our communities with their presence and wisdom.



Persistent Foundation organised a free cataract surgery camp at the Beggars' Rehabilitation Centre in Bengaluru, run by Karnataka's Department of Social Welfare. Of the 200 inmates examined, 100 were screened, and 42 with mature cataracts were selected for surgery. 39 surgeries were successfully performed at the hospital, while 3 patients were advised to return later due to being unfit for immediate surgery. All completed procedures were satisfactory.

### **Saving Lives** Bal Shalyakriya Mission for Pediatric Surgeries

Providing affordable and timely surgical care to children with various congenital disorders, as well as running a programme to address malnutrition.

### Background

In the heart of India's bustling life, numerous children find themselves ensnared in a cycle of delayed medical care, hindered by long waiting lists, financial hardships, and limited awareness. Born from a vision to transform this reality, the Bal Shalyakriya Mission, in collaboration with the Gaud Saraswat Brahmin Sabha in Nagpur, has become a beacon of hope, ensuring timely surgical interventions to mend young lives.

### **Contributions and approach**

Embracing a spirit of collaboration, the Mission unites with NGOs, dedicated medical professionals, and government bodies. Together, we organize surgical camps and screenings, raise awareness, and gather resources to turn the tide against delays in critical surgeries. Through our efforts, we have reignited the spark of hope in 272 children across five districts, offering them a chance at a healthier future with essential surgeries for hernia, hydrocele, phimosis, orchiopexy, and more.

Beyond surgical interventions, our endeavors alongside the Nagai Narayanji Memorial Foundation, Nagpur have provided corrective surgery, therapy, and orthotic support, transforming the lives of 28 children. Our cochlear implant surgery programme, in partnership with Ashray Akruti in Hyderabad, opens a world of sound and speech to those who have lived in silence.

### Brightening futures through compassionate care

The journey of the Bal Shalyakriya Mission in pediatric health care is a testament to the power of collective endeavor, enabling children to lead lives of positivity and joy. Our broader vision includes nutritional support, touching nearly a thousand lives annually, ensuring malnutrition does not diminish the vibrancy of childhood. Through these initiatives, we hope to encourage hope and resilience, believing in a healthier tomorrow for every child.

Testimonial

Bhushan, a 10-year-old from Ramtek village, was born with syndactyly (joined fingers), causing functional difficulties and social stigma. His father, a poor farmer supporting a large family, couldn't afford treatment. After surgery and physiotherapy, Bhushan regained finger function. He now performs skillful activities confidently, overcoming his earlier challenges.

Bal Shalyakriya Mission (BSM) delivers free corrective surgeries for pediatric patients with congenital malformations, focusing on supramajor cases in spine deformity, bladder exstrophy, esophageal atresia reconstruction, anorectal malformation, splenectomy, and plastic surgery.

Key partners include Peedhparai USA, Balmitra Foundation Nagpur, GSB Sabha Nagpur, and Arihant Multispeciality Hospital Nagpur, working with the National Health Mission.

Persistent Foundation, the main sponsor, has consistently funded a major part of the Mission for the last 9 years. They've shown great interest in outcomes, encouraging BSM partners to improve quality and numbers. Persistent also conducts employee volunteering during BSM week.

The Foundation's contributions are crucial to this service, providing life-giving surgeries to needy children from BPL families.

### **Empowering Women** Kiran Girls Scholarship and Mentoring Programme

Building career readiness for underprivileged girls through IT and Computer Science scholarships, mentoring, hands-on corporate experience, soft-skills training, and more.

#### Background

In 2010, recognizing the pressing need for change, the Kiran Girls Scholarship and Mentoring Programme was born to light a path for bright girls from underserved communities, guiding them towards futures filled with opportunities in Information Technology and Computer Science.

Starting with just 10 determined students in Pune and Nagur, the programme blossomed, embracing 40 scholars annually by 2014, extending its reach to nurture dreams through Persistent Systems in India.

At the very core of this endeavor lies a promise not just of gender parity in the zeniths of IT leadership but of a nurturing journey that transcends financial assistance. Through personalized mentorships, we kindle the sparks of technical prowess and individual strength.

### **Contributions and approach**

Through a dedicated scholarship offering ₹ 40,000/- yearly to each of 40 scholars and expanding to welcome 10 additional champions of affirmative action annually this programme has touched 500 lives, turning aspirations into tangible successes. Among our scholars, many have woven their futures with esteemed organisations. 16 have been placed at Persistent Systems, and others at prestigious companies such as Barclays, Amdocs, Capgemini Texas Instruments, CISCO, Flipcart, Dassault Systems, and others. They are not just earning livelihoods but crafting legacies, with salaries in the range of ₹ 6 to 8 lakhs per annum. Additionally, some exceptional performers have received offers ranging from ₹ 18 lakhs to 43 lakhs per annum.

Our scholars, often the first in their families to step through the gates of higher education, stand as testaments to the transformative power of opportunity. With guidance spilling beyond academia, addressing financial, emotional, and social realms, these young women climb towards not just career heights but personal fulfilment.

The Mentoring Programme for Kiran scholars started in 2016-17, and began with the enrollment of 10 affirmative action (SC / ST) students. It includes individual and group mentoring, with sessions available to 1st to 4th year students. For 2nd to 3rd year students, summer and winter residential programmes in Pune and Bengaluru offer further skill development opportunities.

Over the years, Persistent employees have contributed 600+ volunteer hours per year to offer one-on-one guidance to Kiran scholars in various areas—including project work, career planning, coding fundamentals, effective time management, and more.







I've had the opportunity to participate in a diverse range of sessions, including coding, DSA, Python workshops, and online sessions like the BITES Series throughout the year. Our residential winter school provided me with an enriching experience extending beyond academics. Along with sessions on Gen Al, Prompt Engineering, Power Skills, it helped me to make new friends, dream about creating a better future for my family and myself. ### **Joy of Learning** Integrated School Development Programme

Supporting schools and a residential center with improved infrastructure, school amenities, and programmes for a quality education.

#### Background

In the tapestry of our society, each child's potential is a unique thread, essential to the richness of the whole. Recognizing the gaps in school facilities where government aid is scant, our commitment is clear: To develop environments and opportunities for every student to thrive.

With care and collaboration, we work alongside 11 schools, 2 special education institutions, and 1 residential center to foster better learning. From fees to essential kits, our support seeks to bolster attendance and spark the joy of learning.

#### **Contributions and approach**

Through our collective efforts, the lives of thousands of learners have been touched. Our integrated approach has resulted in a swell in school attendance, extracurriculars, and academic spirit, while reducing dropouts.

Evaluating each school's framework allows us to tailor improvements that breathe life into learning spaces—refreshing classrooms, invigorating science and computer labs, libraries, sanitation facilities, playgrounds, and seating.

Our journey of infrastructural development extends beyond the physical, embracing LAN connectivity for digital education, and arming schools with sports kits and educators with rich learning materials.

By nurturing the educators themselves through facilitated training, we have seen a blossoming of innovative teaching methods that captivate and engage young minds.

### **Empowering life beyond academics**

Through our work, the WASH and Life Skills Education Programme took shape, nurturing not only intellect but also well-being and social responsibility. Over the last four years, this initiative has touched the lives of many students.

At its heart, the programme engages a chorus of voices—teachers, support staff, parents in harmonious dialogue on pressing topics from menstrual hygiene to the pressures of adolescence.

The seeds sown have blossomed into behavioral transformation, peer-led WASH clubs, and emergent student leaders. Through the establishment of vigilant hygiene committees and menstrual education panels, we fortify the support for our young women, ensuring they never stand alone.

In every classroom made brighter, every life skill instilled, our Integrated School Development Programme stands testament to the shared triumphs of students and teachers.



Aranyeshwar School, Pune

**Problem:** Aranyeshwar School faced significant hygiene challenges, particularly affecting female students. The school's unhygienic toilets posed health risks, and girls struggled with menstrual hygiene management, impacting their school attendance and overall well-being.

**Intervention:** The school implemented a targeted Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) training programme for girls. This initiative focused on educating students about proper pad changing techniques and disposal methods, addressing critical hygiene concerns.

**Impact:** The intervention yielded substantial positive outcomes. Over 63% of girls now change pads during school hours, significantly reducing health risks. An adolescent group was formed, fostering open discussions about menstruation and reducing stigma. Consequently, more girls now attend school during menstruation, leading to improved educational outcomes and promoting gender equality in education.







### **Careers Through Training**

Vocational Skills Development

Empowering India's youth and creating livelihood opportunities through skill development.

### Background

Many young people in India from lowincome backgrounds have dreams beyond their reach, seeking skills to unlock a brighter future. Our Vocational Skills Development project aims to light their path, offering opportunities for substantial growth.

#### **Contributions and approach**

The Persistent Foundation gently propels young aspirants in Pune, Nagpur, Hyderabad and Goa towards promising careers. To date, we have helped train 2,473 individuals across five different courses, achieving an 81.5% placement rate and bolstering their financial stability with respectable salaries.

In the field of nursing, our collaboration with 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee and Pramith Foundation offers a Patient Assistant Course, providing practical training essential for hospital settings. During our COVID-19 response, have supported 13 students through comprehensive 2-year nursing programme.

Our initiatives extend to training in data entry and mobile repairs, keeping pace with the fast-evolving job market.

Partnering with the Sparsha Trust, Bengaluru, we have established a training center that yearly hones the skills of 120 youths in spoken English, computer operations, retail management and more, preparing them for competitive careers.

The Persistent Foundation, Bengaluru, also supports a Competitive Exam Centre. This programme offers access to extracurricular instruction, lectures by field experts, and library resources. For stress management, special activities are organized, such as drumming sessions. At the center, students also have the opportunity to meet practitioners in the social sector.

### Elevating lives, one skill at a time

Our commitment transcends skill impartation; it uplifts lives. The Persistent Foundation strives to gently nurture the potential of young people, fostering independence. Our impact extends beyond reducing unemployment—it empowers individuals to author their own success stories.



Sarthak Educational Trust, Hyderabad Vishwanath Tharun's journey exemplifies the power of perseverance and support in overcoming adversity. Born with a locomotor disability in Hyderabad, Telangana, Tharun faced numerous challenges throughout his life. As the only child of a daily wage worker and a homemaker, he received unwavering support from his parents, who prioritized his education despite financial constraints.

Throughout his academic years, Tharun struggled with social interactions due to his disability, often facing ridicule from peers. This isolation impacted his confidence and communication skills, hindering his job prospects after graduation. Despite his academic achievements, he faced repeated rejections in job interviews, both due to skill gaps and discriminatory attitudes towards his disability.

A turning point came when Sarthak Educational Trust offered Tharun free skill-building training. Initially skeptical, he embraced the opportunity, discovering newfound confidence and essential skills in communication, computer literacy, and interview techniques. This transformation led to his successful placement as an Employer Installation Coordinator at Optum, an MNC, with a monthly salary of ₹ 23,580/-.

Tharun's story highlights the transformative impact of targeted support and skill development for persons with disabilities, enabling them to overcome societal barriers and achieve professional success.

Pramith Foundation, Goa Tejal, a 31-year old, 12th Std pass, married woman from a joint family, faced financial challenges. Aspiring to contribute, but lacking family support, she enrolled in a 3-month GDA course. During her OJT, she gained hands-on experience and secured a job at Borkar Multispecialty Hospital in Goa, as an assistant nurse in the General Ward, earning a monthly salary of ₹ 9,000/-.



### **Elixir of Life Drinking Water Project**


Addressing water scarcity with our Drinking Water Project in the valleys of Velhe region, improving the lives of villagers in the region.

### Background

Perched at a high altitude in the Western Ghat region and 50 kilometers from Pune, Pasali Sub Valley's contrast is stark: Abundant rainfall but scarce water resources. Basic necessities-clean water, communication, transport, health care, education-remain elusive due to the hilly terrain and lack of proper infrastructure.

Our resolve is to help these communities build long-lasting water reservoirs to lessen the daily burden of collection, shouldered primarily by the women.

### Total 55 open wells constructed



The project has also introduced innovative solutions such as the Neerchakra-a gyroscopic liquid transportation device that reduced the effort of carrying water from 4 km to less than 1 km-extending the availability of drinking water in the summer for nearly three months.

Overall, The Foundation's Drinking Water Project has had a significant positive impact on the water situation in the Pasali Sub valley, improving the lives of the villagers and reducing their struggles for access to clean water and potable drinking water, while also encouraging self-sufficiency in the long-run.

### Contributions and approach

### Lifelines for Villages Watershed—Integrated Development

Adopting a ridge-to-valley approach to conserve rainwater and improve water management in drought-stricken areas of Pune and Nagpur, meeting drinking water and livelihood needs.

### Background

The Government of Maharashtra launched the 'Jalyukt Shivar Yojana' project to make the state drought-free by 2019. The project involves various measures such as deepening and widening of streams, construction of dams and farm ponds, and harvesting rainwater within village boundaries.

To support this effort, the Persistent Foundation has been working in collaboration with government authorities and NGOs to implement watershed projects in villages identified by the government or referred by NGOs.

The projects involve comprehensive watershed development, including desilting streams, construction of check dams, and excavation work. The engagement of stakeholders, including villagers and youth, is fostered through participation and ownership.

The implementation of watershed projects has resulted in several benefits. Villagers have experienced behavioral changes, leading to water budgeting and economic stability. Increased access to water has allowed farmers to engage in crop diversification and improved agricultural production. The durability of soil and water structures downstream has also been strengthened.

The project has improved the health of villagers and reduced women's daily labor, allowing them to focus more on farming. Some recent project highlights in the village of Varude include:

#### FY19-20

Encouragement of community participation, bringing benefits through livestock development initiatives, exposure visits, and capacity building activities.

### FY20-21

Launch of a geohydrological survey and focus on qualitative changes, achieving visible impacts and expanding to neighboring areas despite the pandemic. FY21-22

Introduction of honeybee keeping and solar trap distribution, promoting sustainable agriculture and positively impacting farmers' livelihoods.



Fueled by the positive outcomes of this project, the Foundation also introduced an Integrated Watershed Development Project in Bhavadi village in FY22-23. Various services—for soil and water conservation, drainage line treatment, water recharge measures, farm pond, recharge pits, agriculture development, and more—have been implemented to strengthen resource availability and agricultural production.

The Integrated Watershed Development programme successfully addresses water and livelihood needs in drought-stricken areas using a collaborative approach—involving government authorities, NGOs, and local stakeholders. It continues to expand with new water management and agricultural development projects in the pipeline for sustainable water management. Over the last 15 years, the Persistent Foundation's Community Development efforts have made a significant impact on marginalized communities, touching the lives of 24,492 beneficiaries across 34 villages.

By aligning with the UN's Sustainable Development Goals, we have addressed specific needs such as clean water, sustainable energy, and increased green cover. Our inclusive approach, prioritizing community participation and self-help, has empowered communities to take ownership of their development journey.

Through careful resource allocation and adjustments in inputs and geographies, the communities we support are discovering new ways to overcome challenges and thrive.

Study

Karate village in Patan Taluka, Satara District, had substantial malki forest land that became barren due to tree cutting. In 2021, WRCS and Persistent Foundation initiated a tree plantation project here. Initially puzzled, we understood the team's genuineness after discussions and agreed to the project. Plantation was carried out on 37 hectares, mainly on temple lands and private properties.

We appreciate WRCS's dedication in meticulously executing the project, planting economically useful species, ensuring protection with fencing and fire lines, and installing a 1.5 km pipeline for watering. The villagers cooperated wholeheartedly, helping identify land and resolve issues.

### Disaster Relief Work during the COVID-19 pandemic


